WATER SAVING TIPS FOR THE GARDEN

As we enter the dry summer season, we look for ways to minimize water usage to conserve our water supply. We can maximize our water by using it <u>again</u> in the landscape.

Here are a few tips you can try in your garden:

- When rinsing vegetables or washing rice, collect the rinse water in a bucket or better yet wash these items outside and pour your rinse water over your garden.
- Keep a bucket handy by the outside faucets. When washing up, place the bucket underneath to capture the water. At the end of the day, pour the water over your favorite plant.

 Direct your washing machine water into the landscape. Beware of fabric softeners which may have clay or other materials that may not be good for your soil.

Capture the rain - Why use water from the faucet when you can get water for free! Use a rain barrel to collect rainwater.
