DETAILS: At the event, the BWS will reveal the place-winning artists in Grades K-6 and the

place-winning poets in Grades 7-12, as well as recognize the honorable mention winners for this year's annual contests. Participants were asked to depict the 2016

contests theme, "Pure Water - There Is No Substitute."

This theme was chosen to increase appreciation of Oahu's clean, fresh drinking water as one of our most valuable resources and to remind everyone that we are all responsible to support efforts to protect our precious and finite water supply for generations to come. The BWS received over 2,000 entries from schools across Oahu.
