Good Bug vs. Bad Bug

Beneficial Bugs Workshop at the Halawa Xeriscape Garden

WHAT: Are slugs snacking on your favorite plant? Are your hibiscus leaves lumpy and

bumpy? Some bugs have favorite colors and host plants in your garden, and you could be inviting unwanted guests.
