Neem Tree Workshop at the Halawa Xeriscape Garden

- **WHAT:** An informational workshop offered by the Board of Water Supply (BWS) and Friends of Halawa Xeriscape Garden (FOHXG) will explain how parts of the Neem tree* can be used for organic pest control and as an everyday household remedy.

- **DETAILS:** The magnificent Neem tree* is an unthirsty plant that holds a multitude of insecticidal, medicinal, and water-saving benefits. Dr. Saleem Ahmed, Ph.D, former East-West Center fellow and Neem enthusiast, is excited to demonstrate how the Neem tree can be used as an organic insect repellent; a medicinal poultice to treat acne and open wounds; diabetes control; and other anti-fungal and anti-bacterial uses. Dr. Ahmed will explain how all of these benefits can be accomplished by using the drought tolerant Neem's virulent leaves and twigs as an everyday household remedy.
