The family friendly event includes keiki games, keiki garden planting, educational booths, delicious food, and a free mulch giveaway.

Proceeds from the plant sale support educational programs and classes at the Halawa Xeriscape Garden. The event is co-sponsored by the Friends of Halawa Xeriscape Garden, a non-profit community group that supports educational programs related to water conservation in the landscape.
