BOARD OF WATER SUPPLY REVEALS WATER CONSERVATION POSTER AND POETRY CONTEST WINNERS AT SPECIAL AWARDS CEREMONY

Forty-two school children honored for place-winning and honorable mention entries

HONOLULU – The Board of Water Supply (BWS) revealed the winners of its 2015 Water Conservation Week Poster and Poetry Contests today at a special awards ceremony at the City and County of Honolulu's Mission Memorial Auditorium.

"The BWS's Water Conservation Week program inspires our school children to embrace the important and ongoing lesson that we all must work together to preserve and protect our water supply for now and for the future," said BWS Chair Duane Miyashiro.

The BWS received more than 1,400 posters and 275 poems in the 37th annual poster and 7th annual poetry contests. Winners were selected based on the accuracy of information, originality, creativity, and artistic or poetic ability, based on the student's age, to convey this year's contest theme, "Water Matters-- Conserve It." Winning students were each recognized and presented with awards.

"We appreciate the effort each student put into creating these remarkable works of art and poetry," said BWS Manager and Chief Engineer Ernest Lau. "The entries reflected a solid understanding of and appreciation for our precious water resources, resulting in impressive artistic expressions of ways we each can conserve it for generations to come."

Top honors were awarded to 24 Oahu students in different categories from kindergarten to 12th grade, along with 18 honorable mentions. The contests invited Oahu school students in kindergarten through grade 6 to share their thoughts on the important value of water through poster art, and students in grades 7-12 to use poetry to express their views on the same subject.

The winning and honorable mention artwork and poems will be featured in the BWS's 2016 Water Conservation calendar, which will be printed and made available to the public at the end of the year. The posters and poems will also be posted on the BWS website at www.boardofwatersupply.com to download for free. All winning and honorable mention entries will be on exhibit at:
