## WATER BOARD ADOPTS \$291 MILLION BUDGET FOR FY 2017 AND RETAINS CURRENT WATER RATES

HONOLULU – The Honolulu Board of Water Supply (BWS) at its monthly meeting on May 23, approved the adoption of a \$291.7 million budget for the coming fiscal year starting July 1, 2016. The budget was based on no change to current water rates for FY 2017.

BWS Manager and Chief Engineer Ernest Lau testified that revenues raised from existing rates will be sufficient to cover the cost of operating Oahu's water system for the year ahead. Lau said that \$210.9 million has been budgeted for operating expenditures and \$80.9 million for capital improvement projects (CIP).

The approved Operating budget provides funds to manage and operate the island's water system to ensure the safe and reliable delivery of water to Oahu consumers. This includes monies to pay down outstanding debt on higher interest rate loans from the State Revolving Fund (SRF) and to provide greater borrowing capacity to use lower interest rate SRF loans; repair, maintain, and replace meters to ensure accurate meter readings and customer bills; and repave damaged roadways after main breaks.

The CIP budget will fund research and development projects (\$3.4 million) such as Red Hill Groundwater Monitoring Wells, construction management for various BWS construction projects, and a Waikele Gulch exploratory well.

CIP renewal and replacement projects (\$61.4 million) include pump replacements at Diamond Head Line Booster, Moanalua Wells and Mililani Wells; renovation of Punaluu Wells and Pearl City Wells, and improvements to the BWS accounting system, Nuuanu Reservoir No. 4 Dam, and the BWS's Manana Corporation Yard.

CIP capacity expansion projects (\$2.73 million) include reservoirs in Aina Haina, Kapolei, and Waianae, as well as a recycled water main in Kualakai Parkway and Kalakaua Avenue Water System Improvement, Phase III.
