BOARD OF WATER SUPPLY TO CHANGE PAYMENT ACCEPTANCE POLICY STARTING JANUARY 1, 2017

Credit card payment from non-residential customers will no longer be accepted.

HONOLULU – Effective January 1, 2017, the Honolulu Board of Water Supply (BWS) will accept credit card payments for single-family residential accounts only. Customers affected by this change may still use alternative methods of payment such as cash, check or automatic deductions from their checking/savings account.

This change will not affect the majority of BWS ratepayers who pay with credit cards. About 13% of payment transactions by BWS customers are made via credit card; however, of this amount, approximately 1% are made to non-residential accounts.

"Customer satisfaction is a high priority and we strive to balance it with what is fair to all of our ratepayers," stated Jennifer Elflein, head of Customer Care at BWS. "However, due to a change in contract terms, we can no longer accept credit card payments from customers who are not billed at the residential single-family rate. We will solicit a bid for a new contract in 2017 and hope to re-establish this payment option at a later date."

BWS will be sending letters to inform non-residential customers that paid with a credit card within the past 12 months, of the change in policy. For more information about the change or any questions regarding your account, please call 748-5030.
